Our Lady of Walsingham (24th September)

Our Lady of Walsingham is venerated by both Catholics and Anglicans, each having a shrine. The Shrines are associated with Marian apparition to Richeldis de Faverches, a pious noblewoman, in 1061, in the village of Little Walsingham in Norfolk. Lady Richeldis built a "Holy House", modelled on the Holy House of Nazareth, as she experienced it in a religious ecstasy. Later, Walsingham became the most famous mediaeval shrine and a place of pilgrimage. Richeldis's son Geoffrey left instructions for the building of a priory which passed into the care of the Canons Regular sometime between 1146 and 1174.

In 1340, the Slipper Chapel was built at Houghton St Giles, a mile outside Walsingham. This was the final "station" on the way to Walsingham. It was here that pilgrims would remove their shoes to walk the final "Holy Mile" to the shrine barefoot. It is this chapel which passed into private ownership and later formed the heart of what, in 1934, the English bishops designated the National Catholic Shrine. The Shrine was extended in the early 1980s with the building of the large Chapel of Reconciliation, modelled on a Norfolk barn. The wooden image, carved in Oberammergau, Germany, remains in the Slipper Chapel. It was once associated with the Virgin of Mercy, under the venerated Marian title of Our Lady of Ransom, sometimes locally worded as "Our Lady of the Dowry". The popularity of the Marian cult gradually localized the devotion as "Our Lady of Walsingham". Pope Pius XII granted a canonical coronation to the Catholic image on 15 August 1954. The gold crown, funded by her Our Lady's female devotees, is now venerated in the Shrine Church, now known as the Basilica of Our Lady of Walsingham.

Meanwhile, the Anglican Shrine Church, built in 1938, is in the village of Walsingham itself, next to the ruins of Walsingham Priory. Who knows whether, one day, a new Shrine might emerge from the ruins? For reasons which are self-evident, groups of Anglicans who became Catholics from 2011 onwards were received into what is known as the Ordinariate of Our Lady of Walsingham, joining the mighty throng who converge on a little village in North Norfolk.
