Pentecost

THE FIFTY days of Eastertide draw to a close with the feast of Pentecost. In England, Pentecost used to be called Whitsun and the Whit Monday Bank Holiday was one of the landmarks of the year. 'Whit', of course, comes from 'White', indicating the white veils that girls customarily wore for Confirmation at Pentecost. The Whit Monday walks, well-known in the North of England, were a popular celebration.

Impatient with the moveable feast of Whitsun – moveable because Easter is moveable – the Government introduced the Spring Bank Holiday Monday in 1971. Fixed for the last Monday of May, the Spring Bank Holiday replaced Whit Monday, and people of a certain age continue to ask themselves, year by year, whether swapping a moveable date for a fixed one was a net gain as regards the weather. Whit Monday can fall as early as 16th May (2016) or as late as 14th June (2038). An early Whit Monday was judged too close to May Day (a Bank Holiday in the UK since 1978).

Losing the national focus on Whitsuntide has been one of the ways that the Christian Faith has become marginalised in the public awareness. All is not lost however. We might have lost Whit Monday and the Whit Monday walks. We might have largely lost the Pentecost Octave, culminating in Trinity Sunday. But we have an increased awareness of the period of prayer between Ascension and Pentecost, the original Novena. The disciples waited in the Upper Room for the gift of the Spirit and, as we pray 'Thy Kingdom Come', we too pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the whole Church and amidst a troubled world.

The Pentecost Octave has not been lost irrevocably. Depending on dates, it is possible to have Votive Masses of the Holy Spirit during the week following Pentecost and Trinity Sunday brings the Octave to a fitting end.
