**SAINT OF THE WEEK : ST IRENAEUS OF LYONS, 28 June**

*Born in Asia Minor c.AD 130, Irenaeus became bishop of Lyons, then in Gaul. He wrote a number of important works explaining the faith, and is thought to have been martyred around AD 202. The following is an extract from his work, Against Heresies:*

When the Son of God became incarnate, and was made man, He commenced afresh the long line of human beings, and furnished us, in a brief, comprehensive manner, with salvation; so that what we had lost in Adam—namely, to be according to the image and likeness of God—that we might recover in Christ Jesus. He has therefore, in His work of recapitulation, summed up all things, both waging war against our enemy, and crushing him who had at the beginning led us away captives in Adam, and trampled upon his head, as you see in Genesis that God said to the serpent, 'I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her seed; He shall be on the watch for (*observabit*) your head, and you on the watch for His heel.' For from that time, He who should be born of a woman, [namely] from the Virgin, after the likeness of Adam, was preached as keeping watch for the head of the serpent. [...] For indeed the enemy would not have been fairly vanquished, unless it had been a man [born] of a woman who conquered him. Therefore the Lord professes Himself to be the Son of man, comprising in Himself that original man out of whom the woman was fashioned in order that, as our species went down to death through a vanquished man, so we may ascend to life again through a victorious one; and as through a man death received the palm [of victory] against us, so again by a man we may receive the palm against death.
