NOVEMBER: MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

An extract from St Augustine's work On the Care of the Deceased, given in the Roman Breviary. Pains taken over a funeral; the condition of the grave; care given to the planning of the ceremonies: all these are rather for the consolation of the living than the benefit of the dead. Yet it does not follow that the bodies of the departed are to be despised and flung aside, and above all of the righteous and faithful men; bodies which as organs and vessels their spirit has holily used in their good works. For if, say, a father's garment and ring, is dear to those left behind in accordance with their affection towards their parents, then the bodies themselves are not to be spurned, bodies which truly we wear in more familiar and closer conjunction than any of our clothes or decorations. For these pertain not to ornament or aid applied from outside, but to our very nature.

Let us not think that the dead for whom we have a care are reached by anything except that which, by sacrifices of the altar, or of prayers, or of alms, we solemnly supplicate. However, we do these things diligently for our own near and dear friends, trusting that they may be likewise done unto us by ours. As for the burial of the body: whatever effort is expended on that is no help for salvation, but is rather a work of humanity, done according to that affection by which no one should ever hate his own flesh. Thus it is fitting that we take what care we are able for the flesh of our neighbour, when those who bore that flesh have departed this life. And if people who do not believe in the resurrection of the body do these things, how much more are those who do believe beholden to do the same, since a work of this kind bestowed upon a body, dead but yet to rise again and to remain to eternity, may also serve as a testimony of faith in the resurrection?

Let thine ears be attentive: to the voice of my supplication.

If thou, O Lord, shalt observe iniquities: Lord, who shall endure it?

and by reason of thy law I have waited for thee, O Lord.

My soul hath waited on his word : my soul hath hoped in the Lord.

From the morning watch even unto night: let Israel hope in the Lord.

For with the Lord there is mercy: and with him is plentiful redemption.

And he shall redeem Israel: from all his iniquities.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord: and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

O Lord, hear my prayer: and let my cry come unto thee.

Let us pray.

O God, the Creator and Redeemer of all the faithful; grant to the souls of your servants departed (*N. and N.*) the remission of all their sins, that through pious supplications they may obtain the pardon which they have always desired. Who live and reign for ever and ever. Amen.
