These are the antiphons used before and after the *Magnificat*, the *Canticle of Our Lady*, each evening at Vespers in the days leading up to Christmas. The days on which they are used are given on the front of this newsletter. The tune for each is the same (see *O Emmanuel* above), but the texts change. Each of them is a title of the coming Messiah, and each is drawn in large part from the prophecies of Isaiah. [The last one given here, *O Virgin of virgins*, was used in mediaeval England, and remains in the breviaries of the Premonstratensians, or Norbertines; it comes in part from the Song of Songs].

They are referenced in passing in the 500s AD, and had made their way to Rome a few centuries later. They seem to have been particularly popular amongst the Benedictines, and those at the abbey of Fleury had a tradition of reciting them in descending order of rank, followed by gift-giving to the members of the community. As is often the case with liturgical things, they were not always and everywhere the same, but (with the exception noted) they are now uniform across the Roman rite. You may also hear them at daily Mass (though, oddly in some lectionaries, in the wrong order) used as the Alleluia verse. There are some poetic expansions on them in the *Old English Advent Lyrics*, composed around 800AD, and a very pleasant setting by Charpentier of c.1693, called the *Antiennes O de l'Avent* (H. 36-43).

Two of the antiphons use Hebrew words: *Adonai* is the word read aloud when the *Tetragrammaton*, YHWH יהוה is written or printed, and means 'Lord', or 'my Lord'. *Emmanu-el* means 'God-is-with-us'. These antiphons help to guide, and place in context, our devout and joyful expectation in the remainder of this holy season.
