CANDLEMAS

This Saturday 2 February is the feast of the Purification of Our Lady and the Presentation of Our Lord in the Temple, which for brevity's sake we usually call Candlemas in English. The 9.00am Mass on Saturday morning, and the 5.00pm Mass on Saturday evening, will be of the Feast (the latter will be a Sung Mass with music by Monteverdi, among others), and will have the ceremonies of blessing candles etc. We will also bless the candles for use in church throughout the coming months. If you use candles at home, for prayer or light, why not bring them to church on Saturday or Sunday to have them blessed?

ST BLAISE

The day after Candlemas is the Feast of St Blaise, Bishop and Martyr. Anciently, this feast is associated with a particular blessing: the blessing of throats. This is traditionally done by touching the throat of each person with candles blessed the previous day. Sometimes the candles are lit, in which case only the Sign of the Cross is made—at some distance from the person—so as not to cause more problems than it aims to prevent). The accompanying prayer is:

Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

For people unfamiliar with a Catholic attitude towards prayer and the material world, this is exactly the sort of thing they think is superstitious. Not so, and that cannot be said too strongly. Here is a nice explanation of what it's all about:

The blessing of throats is a sacramental, one of the many ways that Catholics express a vision for life that brings the body, the senses, and the spirit together. It is a tangible expression of an intangible inner longing. Superstition says that, If I do this certain action, I will make God or the saints do something for me. Sacramental faith says, I want to be holy and constantly under God's protection—always reminded of his desire to keep me close and safe. The sacramental action thus reminds us of how we are to respond to God's grace, which is always flowing.

God wants us to be healthy and to use our bodies to praise him. The blessing of throats is a reminder to us of this grace and our need to respond by taking good care of ourselves and using our voices to lift up and not tear down.
