A Responsory from Christmas Matins:

O magnum mysterium,
et admirabile sacramentum,
ut animalia viderent Dominum natum,
jacentem in praesepio:*
Beata Virgo, cujus viscera meruerunt portare
Dominum Jesum Christum.
Ave Maria, gratia plena: Dominus tecum.*

O great mystery,
and wonderful sacrament,
that animals should see
the new-born Lord, lying in a manger!*
Blessed is the Virgin whose womb was worthy
to bear our Saviour, Jesus Christ.
Hail Mary, full of grace: the Lord is with you.

Look at the way the words and the music fit together to make this chant. Following the shapes of the notes (called *neumes*), we can see that there is a relatively modest 'O...' to start it off, and while *mysterium* and *sacramentum* have a number of notes per syllable (this stretching of a vowel over several notes is called a *melisma*) it really gets going at the final -a of *animalia*, animals: think of this as a version of 'the cattle are lowing, the baby awakes...' See also how at *natum*, 'born' or 'new-born', the notes gently descend, as 'He came down to earth from heaven, who is God and Lord of all.' Finally, the joyous 'Ave Maria', a goodly leap up from the preceding note: we have been allowed to join in with the scene before us. Still, remember that even the animals got there first. Happy Christmas!
