FASTING & HOLY COMMUNION

We are soon to enter the season of Lent, when fasting, prayer, and almsgiving are of course much on our minds, but I thought I'd write something on an area we don't often hear much about, namely the Eucharistic Fast; that is, our abstaining from food and drink before receiving Holy Communion. Our Church's *Code of Canon Law* tells us this:

Whoever is to receive the blessed Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from all food and drink, with the sole exception of water and medicine (Canon 919.1)

Where does this come from? We know about St John the Baptist, with his preparation of the way of the Lord by means of his own fasting and prayer, as well as that to which he called his followers. Our Lord also fasted forty days in the wilderness in preparation for his mission of teaching, preaching, and healing. At Antioch (where followers of Jesus were first called 'Christians), they engaged in 'worshipping the Lord and fasting' (Acts 13:2). Christians in Rome would gather to celebrate Sundays and major feasts the day before, spending the Saturday as a Vigil of fasting and prayer: the Mass would be celebrated early on Sunday; the fast would be broken by Holy Communion itself, and a communal meal was eaten thereafter.

We fast because we are creatures of soul and body. We need to prepare ourselves, soul and body, to receive Our Lord. If we have sins to confess, we need to do that first, before Communion. Similarly, the Eucharistic fast gives us greater respect for the Sacrament, which is no ordinary food, but the Bread of Angels. We owe this to Jesus Christ. We know we'll never be perfect, but there are things we certainly *can* do, like confession, and an hour's fast, which at least show willing on our part.

Fasting before receiving the Eucharist, then, isn't something from misty antiquity: the *Code of Canon Law*, which tells us what we should do in this matter, only dates from 1983. Traditionally, the fast began at midnight, which is manageable if Mass is first thing in the morning, followed by breakfast and work or school; but with the advent of evening Masses in the mid-20th century, it becomes much more demanding. With this sort of thing in mind, therefore, BI Pope Paul VI decreased the length of the fast to one hour before receiving the Eucharist (his predecessor, Pius XII, had already brought it down to three hours). This means that you shouldn't eat or drink anything except water and medicine for one hour before communion: an hour before Mass is due to begin is an easy way to remember, but sometimes things are more complicated than that. This discipline does not apply to the sick and elderly, of course: the Church doesn't ask us to keep anything which we physically can't do. As the *Code* says:

The elderly and those who are suffering from illness, as well as those who care for them, may receive the blessed Eucharist even if within the preceding hour they have consumed something (Canon 919.2)

You can always ask advice if you're unsure. So is it a sin not to fast *if* we can? Well, our instructions in this matter are pretty clear... But ask the question another way: is it *good* to fast awhile in preparation for Holy Communion? Absolutely, yes it is. Moreover, it's important that we should never be indifferent to the holy Eucharist, or take it for granted: so can we, in our fasting, watch with him for one hour?
