

NOVEMBER: MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

We have had just had a run of martyrs' feasts, spanning in time from the 1st to the 19th centuries, and in space from Rome to Vietnam. This week, we are closer to home as we keep St Edmund Campion. Alongside this, our readings at daily Masses have included passages from the books of Maccabees, giving an account of (amongst others) the followers of Judas Maccabaeus in the 170s-160s BC. These Jews lived under the rule of the Seleucid Empire, a successor state to the vast conquests of Alexander the Great. The Seleucids were Greek in origin and maintained Hellenistic culture, speaking Greek and introducing their customs wherever they went. This included Judea and Jerusalem, and led ultimately to the Maccabean revolt: not because of the importing of Greek culture *per se*, but because of the bloody persecution of those who observed the Torah (especially by not eating pork and by having their sons circumcised). This culminated in an idol of Zeus being erected at the heart of the Jerusalem Temple. The Maccabean revolt was successful: it is from the accounts of the Temple's subsequent rededication that the Jewish tradition of Hanukkah comes. Such violence and persecution is of course not confined to the Bible, and it is a consequence of living in a fallen world that it is not absent between Christians either. Recall the smashing of images, despoiling of shrines, desecration of the sacred, stripping of the altars, from the time of Edmund Campion. Recall the revolutionaries in France, at Notre Dame in Paris, putting at the high altar -in place of the sacrifice of the Mass, the altar-stone, the crucifix- a dancer dressed as the Goddess of Reason (recall that, and ask for the prayers of the 16 Martyrs of Compiègne). Though there are martyrs made today, and Christians persecuted throughout the world, we can feel somewhat removed from that in Oxfordshire. But, while no one is going to smash our altars and trample on the Blessed Sacrament, it's far from impossible that we could end up effectively doing that for ourselves: Through our lukewarmness, indifference, hardness of heart, the results would be the same: no Faith, no Church, no Mass. Let us not neglect the works of mercy- including, in November, prayer for the dead. Let us honour the martyrs' memories, and continue to preach, and to live, the Gospel of the love of Christ our Saviour.

An act of prayer for the souls of the faithful departed

OUT OF THE DEPTHS I have cried unto thee O Lord: Lord, hear my voice.

Let thine ears be attentive: to the voice of my supplication.

If thou, O Lord, shalt observe iniquities : Lord, who shall endure it?

For with thee there is merciful forgiveness :

and by reason of thy law I have waited for thee, O Lord.

My soul hath waited on his word : my soul hath hoped in the Lord.

From the morning watch even unto night : let Israel hope in the Lord.

For with the Lord there is mercy : and with him is plentiful redemption.

And he shall redeem Israel : from all his iniquities.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord: and let perpetual light shine upon them.

May they rest in peace. Amen.

O Lord, hear my prayer : and let my cry come unto thee.

Let us pray: O God, the Creator and Redeemer of all the faithful; grant to the souls of your servants departed (*N. and N.*) the remission of all their sins, that through pious supplications they may obtain the pardon which they have always desired. Who live and reign for ever and ever. Amen.
