


TRIBUS MIRACULIS
An Antiphon from the Epiphany liturgies:
 Tribus miraculis ornatum,
 diem sanctum colimus:
 Hodie stella magos duxit ad praesepeium:
 Hodie vinum ex aqua factum est ad
 nuptias:
 Hodie in Jordanae a Joanne Christus
 baptizari voluit, ut salvaret nos, Alleluia.

We honour this holy day,
 adorned with three miracles:
 today the star led the Magi to the manger;
 today water was turned
 into wine at the wedding;
 today Christ desired to be
 baptized by John in the Jordan,
 that he might save us. Alleluia.


The feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord,
 sometimes called that of the Manifestation
 of Christ to the Gentiles, is one of the three most important of the Christian calendar,
 along with Easter and Pentecost. It was anciently the collective feast of Christ's first three
 appearances: to the Magi, at Cana of Galilee, and at the Jordan. In the first case, divine
 providence and the service of nature to its Creator led the Wise Men of the East to the
 child. In the second, He worked His first public miracle, and His blessed Mother said to
 them, 'do whatever He tells you.' In the third case, the Holy Spirit descended in the form of
 a dove, and the Father's voice was heard from heaven saying 'This is My Son, the Beloved:
 listen to Him.' These days, as you know, it's on the Magi, the Wise Men, the Three Kings
 that our focus is fixed (the Baptism of the Lord now has its own feastday). But at each of
 the three miracles, you had to be ready, you had to be there, you had to be attentive. The
 Magi had to follow the *right* star; the servants had to listen to Our Lady; those on Jordan's
 bank had to process and try to understand what they had seen and heard. As Our Lord calls
 us each day into His presence at Holy Mass, we should each pray that we might hear his call,
 and be ready to do for Him whatever he asks of us. *Fr Daniel*

KEY POINTS FROM THE LAST PPC MEETING | We welcomed Deacon Michael to our meeting. Michael became a Catholic five years ago and was ordained as a deacon for the Ordinariate in June 17. He will be ordained priest, God willing, in June 2018. Meanwhile he teaches theology and English here and in the USA. It is hoped that he will continue to minister in the parish after priestly ordination. **Youth** Fundraising continues for the ongoing salary of the Youth Worker Melanie, cost being £30K per annum for the diocese, we pay one quarter. Our Parish is sending out letters and leaflets seeking support awaiting responses. **Safeguarding** 10 people attended the most recent training day. **Social media etc** We could do much better in this area, and will give proper thought to this manner of communication; we will look further as to how we can communicate our Parish good news through these channels. Our new parish website will soon be ready. **Opening Holy Rood during the day** To start with the church will be open for prayer on Thursdays from 8.30am. Fridays might also work.
