

NOTES FOR TRINITY SUNDAY

In the Diary This week is the Portsmouth Diocesan Clergy Convocation. Bishop Philip has called together all clergy in active ministry in the diocese for a residential from Tuesday to Thursday. Part of our discussions will be to do with Fr James Mallon's book, *Divine Renovation*. If you are interested in what we'll be talking about, why not get yourself a copy? It's important to say that this is the first clergy convocation for a very long time—please pray for us. Accordingly, there's no Mass in our churches Tuesday-Thursday. The Boars Hill Carmelites have daily Mass at 9.30am, and I understand there are one or two churches over the river in the Archdiocese of Birmingham, too.

We have two funerals over the next week. Please pray for the repose of the soul of Jim Chatting, who has died, fortified by the rites of the Church; for Joan, his widow, and their family. The Mass of Requiem will be offered at 9.30am this Friday, 17 June, at Our Lady of the Rosary. Pray also for the repose of the soul of Rita Pattinson, whose body will be received into Holy Rood in the evening of Sunday 18 June.

Ordinations I We are getting into Ordination season. Please pray for Revv. Anselm D'Mello and Robert Stewart, to be ordained to the sacred priesthood in the cathedral on 25 June, and for James Snyder, to be ordained to the diaconate on 1 July. Pray also for Kit Rodger, to be ordained to the diaconate in Bordeaux for the Emmanuel Community this month. Have you ever considered whether God is calling you to ordained ministry or to the religious life? It may be something at the back of your mind which you're trying to avoid—but if you believe a call to be there, I can promise you it won't go away until you and the Church have begun to explore it.

Ordinations II You might remember, in Fr Paul's time, that I used to say a Mass on Monday and Tuesday at Holy Rood, and had two Ordinariate seminarians as servers. I am pleased to say that Thomas Mason and Jonathan Creer are to be ordained to the diaconate this Saturday 17 June. For my many sins, I am Master of Ceremonies for this Mass, hence my absence this coming Saturday morning. Thomas and Jonathan are the first 'home-grown' Ordinariate clergy—in other words, they entered formation directly from their working lives, and are not former Anglican clergy. There are ten to be ordained deacon for the Ordinariate at this Mass: please pray for them over the coming year, as they exercise their diaconal ministry and, God willing, prepare for ordination to the priesthood. One of the other ordinands is Michael Ward, known to some of us as a leading expert on the works of C. S. Lewis. It is hoped that, if Bishop Philip and Mgr Newton of the Ordinariate are happy, Michael will spend his year as a deacon working in our parish—but I shall have more to say on that next week.

Corpus Christi Next Sunday, we're keeping Corpus Christi. After the 9.15am Mass, we will have a Eucharistic Procession in the church grounds: please bring flower petals or other biodegradable confetti. Our First Communicants will, we hope, take this invitation to put their gladrags back on and give thanks to the Lord Jesus present in the Eucharist. The city procession begins at the Oratory, St Aloysius', at 2.30pm. Gladrags are also in play here, as the posters in church will tell you. We will have Benediction at the end of the 11.15am Mass at Holy Rood, because it is a Good Thing to do. *FrDL*
