NOTES FOR PENTECOST

An act of prayer (especially helpful before examinations):

- V. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful.
- R. And kindle in them the fire of your love.
- V. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created.
- R. And you will renew the face of the earth.

Let us pray. O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of your faithful, grant that by that same Holy Spirit, we may be truly wise, and ever rejoice in your consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

HOW HAPPY, O Lord, am I, who am called to a communion with God the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, in all their works and ways, in all their joys, in all their treasures, in all their glory! I, who have such a Father, having in Him the Fountain of Immortality, Rest, and Glory, and the joy of seeing him creating all things for my sake! Such a Son, having in Him the means of peace and felicity, and the joy of seeing him redeeming my soul, by His sufferings on the cross, and doing all things that pertain to my salvation between the Father and me. THIS WEEKEND we have a Reception into the full Communion of the Catholic Church and Confirmation. It is a very old custom to confirm (and indeed baptise) at Pentecost, just as at Easter. Until 1955, Pentecost had a Vigil, almost identical to the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday (but without the blessing of the paschal candle at the beginning), with many prophecies read, the font blessed, the litany sung, bells at the Gloria and so on. Happily, parts of that Vigil are being restored. Pentecost also had an Octave, just like Easter: we are sustaining that old and laudable practice of continuing to ask for the guidance and comfort of the Holy Spirit by offering Votive Masses of the Holy Spirit in the week following. We should also be careful to make a distinction between people becoming Christians (who have never been baptised), and those who are completing their Christian initiation by reception into the full communion of the Catholic Church and Confirmation (and, of course, Holy Communion). The Easter Vigil is a good time to baptise and confirm adults; Pentecost is a good time to confirm those who are already baptised. Please pray for Katya, who is to be received: and if you would like to become a Catholic —and if you aren't, you really should: it's great—let me know. Fr Daniel
